Current Roughsleeping Figures



Currently 28 on our caseload (WE 05/02/2023)

How does this compare with last year?

Case load of 14 (WE 11/02/2022)

Is it really double? Why is this different? Could it be worse?

Contributing factors re: SWEP/ Winter provision

- No 'In for good' principles
- Limited single bedrooms
- No High support winter shelter
- No dedicated team/ workers
- Building unsustainable
- Currently demand has not outstripped supply
- Female only SWEP space at WLWS
- WINTER SHELTER- RUMI'S!!!
- Flexible activation and deactivation- Brent
- Direct access



Trends....



- Rise in intermittent rough sleepers- linked with immigration status (almost 40% increase in Q3)
- Increase in begging
- Reduction in large encampments/ hotspots
- Late EUSS applications becoming more difficult/ complex.
